
National SAH to Meet in Los Angeles

The 51st Annual Meeting of the Society of Architectural Historians will be held in Los Angeles April 15-19, 1998. The meeting will take place at the Regal Biltmore Hotel (Schultze and Weaver, 1922-23 and 1928), one of the city's most prominent landmarks.

The annual Historic Preservation Colloquium will kick off the festivities on Wednesday. This Colloquium, co-sponsored by the Los Angeles Conservancy, may be attended independently of the annual meeting, and will focus on Los Angeles' historic movie theaters. Colloquium activities will include a tour of the theater district, a lunchtime presentation at the Los Angeles Public Library, and a bus trip to the Hollywood Boulevard National Register Historic District.

The Los Angeles Meeting will feature an opening presentation by Robert Winter with a reception to follow. Thursday night participants will enjoy a reception in the Bradbury Building, one of Los Angeles' most extraordinary architectural interiors.

On Friday morning a special session of the California State Historical Resources Commission will be held

in the Los Angeles Central Library, a few blocks from the Biltmore Hotel. Interested conference attendees are welcome to participate in this public hearing.

American Institute of Architects

The American Institute of Architects will hold its annual meeting in San Francisco from May 14 - 17, 1998. The AIA last visited San Francisco in 1985 and is expecting 12,000 AIA members and affiliates to attend. The AIA is seeking volunteers for this exciting event. California Historical Society

In conjunction with the AIA convention, the California Historical Society will open an exhibit entitled Building California: Technology and the Landscape. The exhibit will survey the history of architecture in northern California from the late 18th century to World War II, including buildings of Native Americans, Mexicans and Americans. The exhibit will examine the issue of architectural regionalism in northern California as a response to such conditions as earthquakes, fires, and flooding. The exhibit will run from May 7 through August 15.

The 1998 California Preservation Foundation (CPF) Conference will be hosted by both CPF and the Berkeley Architectural Heritage Association (BAHA) from May 7-10, 1998.
