The GMP provides the long-range vision and sets forth the basic management philosophy and guidelines for the park for the next twenty years. From San Francisco and the East Bay Take I-80 eastbound to I-580 westbound, toward San Rafael and exit at Canal. Turn left at the bottom of the ramp. Proceed down to Canal to the Port of Richmond gate and pass through. Follow the signs to the "SS Red Oak Victory." You will pass along the edge of a large car lot and several large maritime businesses. Proceed through the gate at the ship's berth and park on the pier.

From Sacramento

Take I-80 westbound to the Richmond Parkway exit. Follow the Richmond Parkway. When the Parkway crosses beneath I-580 it turns into Canal. Follow the directions above to the Red Oak Victory.
